

Environmental Justice in the Clovis Ethanol Permit Process



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Background

- Governor's Executive Order –
 18 November 2005
- Establishes a framework for addressing and implementing environmental justice at the state level of government. The Executive Order has four goals that affect the issuance of air quality permits.

Executive Order Goals

Provide meaningful opportunities for involvement to all people regardless of race, color, ethnicity, religion, income, or education level in decisions that may affect environmental quality and public health.

2) Ensure that all publicly disseminated information is available in Spanish and in English and, as appropriate, in tribal languages.

Executive Order Goals - 2

3) Utilize available environmental and public health data to address impacts in low-income communities and communities of color as well as in determining siting, permitting, compliance, enforcement, and remediation of existing and proposed industrial and commercial facilities.

4) Environmental justice shall be accomplished within the bounds of and consistent with the Department's existing statutory and regulatory authority.

Clovis Ethanol Plant

 110-million-gallon-a-year ethanol plant co-located with ConAgra's existing Peavey Co. West grain handling facility at Clovis, NM

Clovis Ethanol Plant EJ Issues Claimed

- Impact the Hispanic and Black communities more than any other (NAACP involvement)
- Adverse affects on nearby residents and school (1/2 mile) and a hospital (2 miles)
- 77% of the children at that school came from low income and minority families

Implementation of E.O. - 1

1) Meaningful Participation

- Public meeting, 12 Dec 06
- Public hearing, 11 Jan 07
- Application documents available at Clovis office

2) Information in multiple languages

- Hearing notice in Spanish
- Offered translation service at hearing

Implementation of E.O. - 2

- 3) Use environmental & health data to determine impact
 - No standard to determine if air emissions will cause adverse impact regarding EJ
 - Air dispersion modeling demonstrated that plant emissions would not cause adverse health impact on anyone outside the property

Implementation of E.O. - 3

- 4) Accomplish E.O. objectives within existing authority (statute & regs)
 - Deny a NSR permit only if requested action will not comply with federal or state air quality regulations
 - Air regulations do not address zoning or land use
 - May impose reasonable restrictions and limitations not related to pollutant emissions

Clovis Ethanol EJ Permit Conditions

- Store dry distiller grain soluble material, DDGS, in an enclosure that prevents wind erosion, water erosion, DDGS escape, and DDGS-contaminated water from escaping
- Construct and operate retention ponds to ensure that they are not a source of VOC and H2S emissions nor a source of odors
- Increase the height of the RTO stack(s) from 50 to 100 feet

Clovis Ethanol EJ Permit Conditions

- Initial emissions test to confirm minor source status for HAPs
- Conduct semi-annual public meetings for 5 years after permit issuance regarding actual emissions and permit compliance
- Modify the permit for the co-located grain handling facility to reduce fugitive dust

Epilogue

- Cabinet Secretary's order to issue permit, 25 May 07
- Citizens appeal the order based on a confusing public notice and on environmental justice
- NM Environmental Improvement Board (EIB) hearing, Sept 07
- EIB refused to rule on EJ issue and remanded case to Environment Department for another hearing, 8 Jan 08
- Applicant withdrew application, 25 Jan 08
