






COAL and ELECTRICITY EXPORTER

CHEAP HYDRO POWER





SOUTHERN MONTANA ELECTRIC (SME)

- 250-Megawatt (MW) Coal-Fired Steam/Electric Generating Station
- Located approximately 8 miles East of Great Falls, Montana
- Circulating Fluidized Bed Boiler
 - Limestone Injection
 - Fabric Filter Baghouse (FFB)
 - Hydrated Ash Re-injection System (HAR)
 - Selective Non-catalytic Reduction (SNCR)

SME PERMIT TIMELINE

- Application Submitted November 2005
- Permit Issued 3423-00 May 2007
 - Appealed April 2007
- BER Remanded Permit May 2008
- Associated Court Cases Ongoing
- Remanded Permit Issued November, 24 2008
 - Appealed November, 25 2008
- Application For A Gas-Fired Plant Submitted -April 2009

APPEAL ISSUE

- BACT, BACT, BACT
 - PM_{2.5} vs. PM₁₀ Surrogate
 - Lack of Control Efficiency Data for PM_{2.5}
 - Lack of Reference Test Method
 - BACT Control Equipment vs. Emissions Limit
 - BACT for CO₂?
 - Top-Down BACT / NSR Manual














CONSEQUENCES

- Programmatic
 - PM_{2.5} BACT Becomes Default
 - Significant Legal Costs Increase Focus on Permit Fees
- Local
 - Significant Power Cost Increase for Rural Electric Co-ops
- Legislative

LEGISLATIVE RESPONSE

- 17 Proposed Bills
 - Legislative Control of Administrative Rules
 - Revise Montana Environmental Policy Act
 Exempt AQ Permits from Review
 - Limit Permit Appeals
 - Abolish/Limit Board of Environmental Review
 - Environmental Impact Ombudsman
 - Office Economic Development

HB 483 APPEAL OF AQ PERMITS

- Limits Appeal Issues to Comments Raised
- Permit Applicant Chooses Forum
- Requires Bonding under Certain Circumstances
- Gives Deference to the Agency's BACT Decision
- Limit's Time for BER to Issue Decision
- Applies to Energy Development Projects
