A Comprehensive Initiative

- Advancing core policies and programs
 - Energy efficiency
 - Renewable energy
 - Addressing transportation emissions
 - Performance benchmarks
 - Best practices for workforce development

Emissions Trading Design Elements

- High-quality emissions data from mandatory reporting
- Allowance budgets set by Partner jurisdictions
- High-quality offset credits
- Compliance flexibility and price certainty
- Maintaining competitiveness and preventing emissions leakage
- Electricity sector: Uniform treatment of in-state and imported generation

Approach to Regional Program

- Individual state/provincial programs
 - Each state/province adopts its own rules
 - Harmonized around essential elements
 - Linked to create a regional trading market
 - Recognize each others' compliance instruments

Linking Benefits

- WCI jurisdictions' programs developed in concert to allow linking
- Linking formalized once programs are in place
- Potential benefits to linking:
 - Greater reductions
 - Lower costs for reductions and administration
 - Higher liquidity
 - Reduction in competitiveness concerns

Emissions Trading Implementation

- Tracking system development underway
- In collaboration with WCI Partners, California ARB released RFPs September 9, 2011
 - Auction and Reserve Sale Operator
 - Financial Services for Auction and Reserve Sale
 - Independent Market Monitor
 - Market Monitor Trainer

Emissions Trading Implementation Status

- California endorsed regulation December 16, 2010; two packages of changes to regulation; Complete by October 28, 2011
 - Program starts January 1, 2012; system testing, auctions, allocation and trading
 - Compliance obligation starts January 1, 2013
- Québec published draft regulation July 4, 2011; planned final regulation this fall
- British Columbia, Manitoba have completed public consultation periods
- Ontario is collecting mandatory reporting data before writing regulation
