

Minnesota's responses

- Regulatory Authority
 - MPCA does not have additional permit denial authority or mandatory emissions reductions
 - MPCA does have additional statute authority for cumulative analysis and strengthened MEPA
 - Unintended consequences
 - MPCA issues expiring and non-expiring permits
- Engagement
 - Some programs within the agency evaluate the effectiveness of engagement efforts differently.
 - Several MPCA programs track meeting and event attendance #s, email & website interactions, # of meetings & public events, informal feedback, comments and/or quality of comments, utilization of materials created, and the # of complaints responded to.
 - Informal conversations have been very effective
 - Giving communities resources or tools to communicate concerns, other than permit comments
- Analytical
 - Yes, we do cumulative analysis, within the above reg authority
- Training
 - Program is evolving
- Administrative
 - Health department provide tracking data portal (we are an environmental health tracking state)
 - US Census
 - EPA
 - Department of Transportation
 - Gov Delivery

General Highlights

- Responses suggest 'a lot of work in the works'
- Some states cumulative analyses limited to National Ambient Air Quality modeling demonstration
- Some differing understanding between agency sections and divisions
- Some states have guides to engagement on their websites or in their practices
- CA, MA, City of Albuquerque, WA, and NJ have additional cumulative impacts authority
- Some states have begun to have Environmental Justice trainings through EPA
- More formal EJ engagement policies and practices than additional regulatory authority

Engagement Highlights

- **Michigan** Their Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act (NREPA) requires that there's an opportunity for public comment and a public hearing on draft permits for which there is **known public controversy**.
- Massachusetts policy requires enhanced public participation if their state environmental policy act is triggered. Uses specific guidance for reaching out to EJ populations within either 1 mile or 5 miles of a project depending on the permitting decision at the time of application.
- **Oregon** Community engagement **risk levels** requires community engagement before permit is drafted, if above thresholds.
- New Jersey requires Environmental Justice Impact Statement (EJIS) and public information sessions for applicant to receive feedback on project. This is required to deem application complete.
- Alabama has a citizen's guidance document for public engagement. All files and records on regulated parties are searchable online.


Map of yes and no responses
