NAAQS

- Lead final
 - October 2008
- 1997 Ozone Standards
 - Infrastructure AND Attainment Findings of Failure to Submit made March 2008
 - Over 30 Findings for Infrastructure (110(a)) SIPs started FIP clocks only
 - 13 Finding for Attainment SIPs started Sanction and FIP clocks
- 1997 PM_{2.5} Standard
 - Infrastructure Findings of Failure to Submit made October 2008 (SIPs due in 2000)
 - 21 FIP clocks started
 - Attainment SIPs were due April 2008
- Regional Haze
 - SIPs were due December 2007
 - Only 14 submitted of 52 due, 11 from CAIR states
- 2006 PM_{2.5} Standard
 - Designations December 2008
- 2008 Ozone Standard
 - Designations due in June 2009
 - Monitoring in smaller urban areas by 2011



Climate-Air Quality

- Permitting Issues
 - 17 issued or proposed permits with GHG or GHG/ESA related issues
- New Source Performance Standards
 - Refineries – issued in April 2008
 - Cement – due May 2009
- Climate Impacts on Air Quality
 - Global Climate Impacts on Air Quality Interim Report



Air Toxics Rules

- Mercury
 - Next steps following CAMR vacatur
- Area Source Rules
 - Group 1 – highest priority – issued.
