




Central Office – Des Moines

Air Quality – Core Purpose

- Protect Public Health & Welfare
 - Health
 - National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS)

Public Welfare

- Economic viability of an area
- o Property values
- Other more traditional measures





What is a Permit?

- Legal tool
 - Extension of the regulations
 - \circ Reflects outcome of permit review process
 - \circ Defines what is expected of source
 - Primary basis for enforcement
 - Basically a contract
 - $\circ\,$ Between company and regulatory agency





Permitting & Enforcement

- Separate but linked
- Enforceability
 - Chief concern
 - Clarity of standards important to:
 - Permit writers
 - Compliance
 - Regulated community
 - Public
 - \circ Recordkeeping, reporting, and monitoring





2009 CAA Enforcement Workshop

- Disconnect between enforcement & permitting?
 - Possible reasons
- Opportunities for better coordination
 Avoid "commingling"
- Best practices to ensure effective coordination





Effect of Little to No Coordination

- The Good
 - Reduced emissions example

• The Bad

- Misuse of the term BACT
 - Causes confusion
 - Companies try to use Consent Order "BACT" limits in future permitting

• The Ugly

- No NAAQS review
- Consent Order terminated early
 - Lost limits









Iowa – Separate Job Functions

Permitting

- Applicability determinations
 - PSD
 - NSPS
 - NESHAP
- Permit writing
- Requests for information
- Site visits
- Technical assistance


Compliance

- Stack test reviews
- Variances
- Investigate potential violations
- Compliance reports
- Inspections (Field Offices)
- Enforcement letters
- Referrals
- Compliance assistance



Communication/Coordination

- Section meeting attendance
 - Representative from each section
- Work requests
 - Provides documentation



- Some draft permits sent to compliance
 - Evaluate enforceability & testing
- Some draft referrals sent to permitting
 - Review technical aspects and applicability
 - Review permitting timelines





Lessons Learned

- Constant communication is necessary
 - Regular meetings
 - Talk to other sections \longrightarrow ask questions
- Discuss specific areas of concern
 - Permit or Consent Order language
 - \circ Enforceability
 - \circ Agreement on what the language says
 - Stack testing requirements
- Training
 - Basic understanding of other areas
