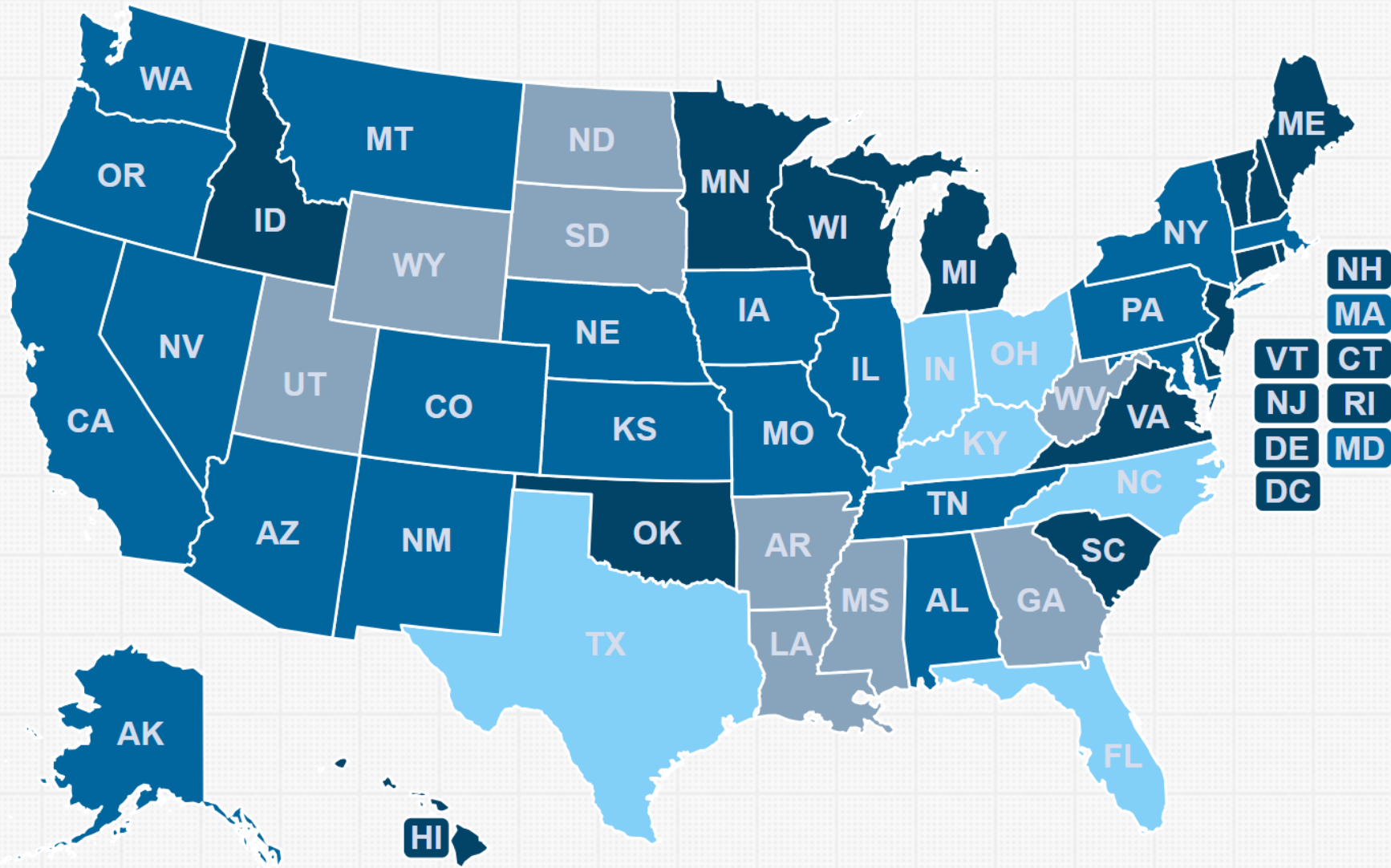

Petitions for Review of Clean Air Act Rules in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit

Status reports due every 60 days. 3/18/19 status report: case is being held in abeyance due to regulatory stay.	On 5/10/00, most of the parties in <u>Appalachian Power Co. v. EPA</u> , No. 99-1200 et al., filed a motion to hold in abeyance all challenges in those cases to the determinations by EPA in its rules under CAA Section 126 that are based on the 8-hour ozone NAAQS. On 5/31/00, the court granted that motion, ordering those challenges held in abeyance pending further order of the court. The court severed those challenges from No. 99-1200 and assigned them this docket No. 00-1223. The Section 126 rules at 40 C.F.R. § 52.34(k) provide that the effectiveness of the 8-hour determinations is stayed indefinitely; that stay remains in effect.
