

Amendments to H.R. 4821 Adopted on November 2-3, 2023

28. Boebert (CO) #19 Transfers \$5,000,000 from EPA bureaucracy to hazardous fuels reduction activities within BLM.

35. Boebert (CO) #18 Transfers \$5,000,000 from EPA bureaucracy to fund active forest management at USFS.

39. McCormick (GA) #106 (REVISED) Reduces funding for the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Environmental Programs and Management account by \$17 million. Reallocates \$10 million for increased oversight of the EPA (IG) and cuts spending by \$2 million.

58. Westerman (AR), Moylan (GU) #82 Reduces funding for the operation of the Council on Environmental Quality by \$2,750,000 to its currently authorized level of \$1,000,000.

79. Burlison (MO) #167 Prohibits fund to enforce the final rule of the Environmental Protection Agency titled "Endangerment and Cause of Contribute Findings for Greenhouse Gases Under Section 202(a) of the Clean Air Act."

81. Cammack (FL) #97 Prohibits funds from being used to finalize any rule or regulation that has resulted in or is likely to result in an annual effect on the economy of \$100 million or more.

88. Fallon (TX) #191 Prohibits the use of federal funds for community-scale ambient air monitoring.

91. Gosar (AZ), Crane (AZ), Perry #94 Prohibits funding to be used to finalize, implement, or enforce the proposed rule by the EPA titled "Reconsideration of the National (10 minutes) (PA), Lesko (AZ) Ambient Air Quality Standards for Particulate Matter."

96. Grothman (WI) #262 (LATE) Prohibits funds to develop, finalize, issue, or use assessments under EPA's Integrated Risk Information System (IRIS).

97. Hageman (WY) #66 Prevents any funding from being made available to finalize or implement the CEQ guidance entitled "National Environmental Policy Act Guidance on Consideration of Greenhouse Gas Emissions and Climate Change."

102. McCormick (GA) #105 Prohibits funds from implementing Executive Orders 14037 of August 5, 2021 (86 Fed. Reg. 43583; relating to strengthening American leadership in clean cars and trucks), Executive Order 14057 of December 8, 2021 (86 Fed. Reg. 70935; relating to catalyzing clean energy industries and jobs through Federal sustainability), or Executive Order 14096 of April 21, 2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 25251; relating to revitalizing our Nation's commitment to environmental justice for all).

104. Miller (IL) #210 Prevents funds from being used for the Environmental Protection Agency's "Solar for All" grant competition.

108. Norman (SC) #13 Prohibits funding for the American Climate Corps

109. Norman (SC) #14 Prohibits funding for rule titled “Control of Air Pollution From New Motor Vehicles: HeavyDuty Engine and Vehicle Standards”

111. Norman (SC) #28 Prohibits funding for the Interagency Working Group on the Social Cost of Greenhouse Gases

114. Norman (SC), Nehls (TX) #5 Prohibits funding for EPA's Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Workgroup

117. Ogles (TN) #63 Prohibits funds to be used by the Environmental Protection Agency for the U.S. Global Change Research Program

120. Ogles (TN) #117 (REVISED) Prohibits funds to carry out the provisions of section 50262 of Public Law 117- 169 (Inflation Reduction Act)

123. Perry (PA) #226 (REVISED) Prohibits the use of funds to give formal notification under, or prepare, propose, implement, administer, or enforce any rule or recommendation pursuant to, section 115 of the Clean Air Act (42 USC 7415).

124. Posey (FL) #205 Reduces the EPA-Environmental Programs and Management account for the Office of Air and Radiation by 50 percent.

126. Roy (TX) #30 Prohibits funds from being used to carry out environmental justice activities. (10 minutes)

127. Roy (TX), Cammack (FL), Brecheen (OK), Norman (SC), Nehls (TX) #32 Prohibits funds from being used to implement any of President Biden's executive orders on climate change.

129. Stauber (MN) #163 Prohibits any funds from being used to implement or enforce the Biden Administration’s NEPA Phase 1 regulations. (10 minutes)

130. Stauber (MN) #164 Prohibits any funds from being used to finalize, implement, or enforce the Biden Administration’s proposed NEPA Phase 2 regulations.
