

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF CLEAN AIR AGENCIES HYBRID FALL MEETING October 19-20, 2022

The National Association of Clean Air Agencies (NACAA) held its 2022 Hybrid Fall Membership Meeting on October 19-20, 2022 in person and via Zoom Webinars. Presentations provided by speakers are available electronically on Air Web — NACAA's members-only website. Below are minutes of the NACAA Business Meeting, held Thursday morning, October 20, 2022, followed by the Membership Meeting agenda.

MINUTES NACAA BUSINESS MEETING Thursday, October 20, 2022

Frank Kohlasch (MN) and Rollin Sachs (Olathe, KS), Co-Presidents of NACAA, called the Business Meeting to order.

Election of Officers

Rollin Sachse (Olathe, KS), Local Co-President, introduced the local slate of nominees for the NACAA Board of Directors, who would serve one-year terms. There were no nominations from the floor and the local slate was approved by a vote of 32 yea, 0 nay and 2 abstentions.

Frank Kohlasch (MN), Chair of the State Nominating Subcommittee, introduced a revised slate of state nominees for the NACAA Board of Directors, who would serve one-year terms. The first motion, which was to approve the substitute slate passed unanimously. There were no nominations from the floor and the state slate was approved by a vote of 33 yea, 0 nay and 3 abstentions.

NACAA Financial Reports

Miles Keogh, Executive Director of NACAA, explained the association's financial reports and provided details about the association's current finances. The reports included information about the NACAA treasury account (i.e., non-grant funds) as well as NACAA's grant from EPA.

Recognition of Leadership

Miles Keogh (NACAA) recognized three retiring air directors – Fran McNair (Olympic Region, WA), Ursula Kramer Nelson (Tucson, AZ) and Craig Kenworthy (Seattle, WA) – for their active and sustained participation in and leadership of the association.

NACAA Program Funding Discussion

Kelly Crawford (DC), Co-Chair of the NACAA Program Funding Committee, explained that the Board of Directors is being asked to vote to adopt a position on recommendations for state and local air grant funding for the upcoming fiscal year (FY 2024). This position would then be incorporated into NACAA communications and correspondence with Congress (including testimony), EPA and others in the weeks and months that follow. The proposal on which the board would vote had been sent to the board via email twice in the weeks leading up to the meeting. It is generally the same as NACAA's recommendations for FY 2023. Briefly, the recommended position called for the following:

- \$500 million in federal grants to state and local air agencies to carry out current programs and new challenges expected in the near future;
- flexibility for state and local air agencies to use federal grants for the highest-priority needs in their areas;
- retention of PM_{2.5} monitoring funds under Section 103, so agencies do not need to match funds to obtain the grants; and
- including grant increases under authorities of the Clean Air Act that do not require matching funds (e.g., Section 103) as much as possible, so agencies without sufficient matching funds can still obtain the grants.

Following a brief discussion, the state board members and then the local board members voted unanimously to approve the recommendations for FY 2024 funding.

Other Business

There was no other business.

The NACAA Business Meeting was adjourned.
