- Appropriations in 2022-2023
- American Rescue Plan
 - \$22.5 million in direct grants
 - \$20 million in competitive grants
 - \$5 million in mobile monitoring
- BIF and BBB: What else are we working on?

- NACAA's Training Committee may be a key asset







