# Who We Are

The State Funding Readiness Project (SFRP) Coalition is led by Hua Nani Partners in partnership with the US Climate Alliance.

# What We Do

Thanks to philanthropic funding, SFRP provides <u>free</u> technical support to states implementing funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law and Inflation Reduction Act for climate-positive projects that advance climate equity priorities.

We help boost state capacity through our **State Implementation Strike Team**, a **cohort of technical experts** across transportation electrification, energy and grid systems, grant writing, state budgets, and environmental justice.

# What We've Done

In the last year, SFRP has supported **15 different states** with federal grant applications and foundational readiness projects such as stakeholder mapping, workforce landscape analysis, and grant opportunity mapping.

This included support for **13 state applications** for federal funding **\$232,418,537**. Grant programs that we've supported include the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Program, the RAISE Grant Program, the Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Grant Program, the Grid Resilience Grants, the Grid Resilience and Innovation Partnerships (GRIP) Program, the Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG), and the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF).

# What We Offer

#### **CPRG Planning Grants**

Development support for the **Priority Climate Action Plan** (PCAP) due March 1, 2024, the **Comprehensive Climate Action Plan** (CCAP) due in 2025, and the 4-year **Status Report** due in 2027.

SFRP can assist with various elements required by these plans, including low income/disadvantaged communities benefits analyses, stakeholder mapping, identifying complementary funding sources, workforce planning analyses, budget planning, intergovernmental coordination, and more.

#### **CPRG Implementation Grants**

The Notice of Funding Opportunity is expected to be released in September 2023 and the application will be due April 1, 2024.

SFRP can provide application support for the competitive CPRG **Implementation Grant application**, including grant writing, Justice40 compliance, stakeholder engagement, technical sector-specific guidance, and more.
