# Area Sources Subject to MACT Exempt from Title V

- ◆ ~ 700 Perchloroethylene Dry Cleaners
- ◆ Two Halogenated Solvent Cleaning Facilities
- ◆ 22 Chrome Electroplating and Anodizing Facilities
- ◆ Seven Sweat Furnaces and one Secondary Aluminum Manufacturing Facility
- ◆ One Ethylene Oxide Commercial Sterilizer

# Permitting for Area Sources Subject to MACT

## ◆ Perc Dry Cleaners

- Generic Permits

## ◆ Secondary Aluminum Manufacturers, Chrome Electroplaters, and Halogenated Solvent Cleaning

- SIP Permits

## ◆ Ethylene Oxide Sterilizer

- Currently holds a Title V permit but has requested a synthetic minor permit

# Inspections and Compliance Assistance for Area Sources Subject to MACT

## ◆ Perc Dry Cleaners

- Enforcement Initiative 1998-1999
- Currently inspected on a complaint basis
- Small Business Assistance Program activity
  - ◆ Compliance Assistance
  - ◆ Calendars
  - ◆ Trade Groups

# Inspections and Compliance Assistance for Area Sources Subject to MACT

## ◆ Halogenated Solvent Cleaning

- Inspected once every 2-3 years
- Periodic report review

## ◆ Chrome Electroplaters

- Inspected once every 2-3 years
- Periodic report review

# Inspections and Compliance Assistance Prior to December 2005

## ◆ Secondary Aluminum Manufacturing

- Rely on District Offices to locate non-compliant sweat furnaces
  - ◆ Required to either replace with compliant unit or cease operation
  - ◆ Refer to Small Business Assistance Program

# Money Details

- ◆ Area Source MACT activities funded with
  - Performance Partnership Grant Money
  - Synthetic Minor Permit Fees
  - Title V Fees (Small Business Assistance Program)
- ◆ Time dedicated to the Area Source MACT Activities:
  - Roughly 1/2 “Full Time Equivalent” in the Compliance Program
  - 2 “Full Time Equivalents” in Small Business Assistance Program

# Who pays Permit Fees in Georgia?

- Synthetic Minor Sources
  - ◆ \$1,000 annually
- NSPS Sources
  - ◆ \$1,500 annually
- Title V Sources
  - ◆ \$2,500 minimum; or \$32.50 per ton



# Changes in MACT Area Source Activities after Exemption from Title V Finalized?

- ◆ No significant change
- ◆ Continue to focus on compliance assistance through the Small Business Assistance Program
- ◆ Minimal inspection
