Tracking Upsets (Emissions Events) Online







Background

- Regulated Entities required to submit emissions events information via a secure web server
 - 2003, HB-2912
 - State of Texas Electronic Environmental Reporting System (STEERS)
- Initial Report required
 - Within 24 hours of discovery
 - Straightforward information
- Final Report required
 - 14 days after the discovery of the event



Background

- Scheduled Maintenance, Startup and Shutdown activities
 - STEERS notification required
 - 10 days or as soon as practicable before activity
 - Region office reviews data
 - Contacts regulated entity prior to activity commencement



Background

- Information from STEERS goes to
 - Internal investigation database Consolidated Compliance and Enforcement Database System (CCEDS)
 - Region Office receives an email with the upset information
 - Upsets are prioritized for investigation



Background

- Reporting
 - Annual Enforcement report
 - Emissions Events Portion
 - Utilize a crystal report to gather information
 - Contaminants
 - Pounds
 - Number of events
