Area Sources

- Dry Cleaners – about 2000
 - State Rule Is Stricter Than Subpart M
- Chromium Plating – 55
- Solvent Cleaning – 131
- DEC Revenue approx. \$350,000
 - Estimated Title V Fees would be <\$100,000
 - Compare with ~\$40 million for NYS Air program



Inspections in 2005

- Dry Cleaners
 - 1900 Third Party Inspections
 - Avg cost to facility about \$300
 - 159 DEC Inspections
- Chromium Plating - 4 Inspections
- Solvent Cleaning – 8 Inspections



Expenses to State (Area Source MACT)

- State Inspector/Reviewer Time (pro rata)
 - \$670,000
- Program Oversight
 - \$190,000
- Legal Staff
 - \$130,000
- Estimated Total ~\$990,000



Small Business Assistance Program

- Program Is Required Under Title V
- NYS Environmental Facilities Corp.
 - Quasi-State Agency funded by DEC
 - \$800K from Title V permit fees
- Performs outreach on a number of Federal and State rules
- Provides confidential compliance assistance



NYS Summary

- Area Source MACT Program is about One-Third Funded by Registration Fees
- Registration Fees Are More Than Title V Fees Would Be
- Less Than 10% of Sources are Inspected By DEC Personnel
